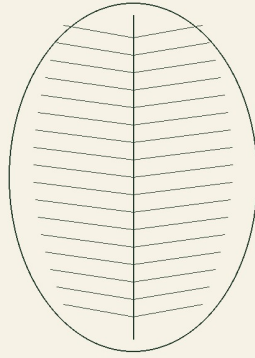

Interpretive Themes

All educational materials should reinforce:

- Life Flourishes Where the Conditions for Flourishing Are Cultivated
- Healthy Land Creates Healthy Communities
- Stewardship is Responsibility Across Generations
- Every Person Can Be a Steward

Guided Walk Standards

Every guided walk includes:

- Welcome
- Safety briefing
- Site history
- Ecology
- Stewardship practices
- Reflection
- Questions
- Closing invitation

Target duration: 60–90 minutes.

School Programs

Develop programs by age group. Topics may include:

- Forest ecology
- Watersheds
- Wildlife
- Pollinators
- Soil
- Climate resilience
- Stewardship
- Habitat restoration

Outdoor Classrooms

Learning spaces should include:

- Seating
- Shade
- Accessibility where practical
- Native plants
- Demonstration areas
- Quiet reflection spaces

The landscape itself becomes the classroom.

Interpretive Signs

Every sign should answer:

- What is here?
- Why does it matter?
- How does it work?
- What can visitors observe?
- How can they help?

Use plain language, illustrations, and durable materials.

Citizen Science

Future projects may include:

- Bird surveys
- Pollinator counts
- Water-quality monitoring
- Plant inventories
- Phenology observations
- Wildlife cameras
- Forest health monitoring

All data should follow documented protocols. No invented results.

Seasonal Programming

Spring — Wildflowers. Migration. Tree planting.

Summer — Water. Pollinators. Prairies.

Autumn — Seeds. Migration. Forest ecology.

Winter — Animal tracking. Forest structure. Planning.

Storytelling

Stories should highlight:

- Landscapes
- Communities
- Restoration
- Science
- Volunteers
- Future possibilities

Avoid exaggeration. Use verified examples when describing real projects.

Exhibits

Future exhibits may include:

- Watershed models
- Root system displays
- Soil profiles
- Wildlife identification
- Stewardship timelines
- Historic landscape photographs
- Interactive maps

Publications

Educational publications include:

- Field guides
- Children's books
- Steward journals
- Species checklists
- Habitat guides
- Annual reports
- Research summaries

All should follow the Brand & Editorial Standards Manual.

Digital Learning

Future resources may include:

- Interactive maps
- Online courses
- Recorded lectures
- Virtual field trips
- Species databases
- Downloadable lesson plans

Digital tools should complement, not replace, direct experience outdoors.

Accessibility

Programs should strive to be welcoming and accessible. Consider:

- Clear language
- Visual aids
- Multiple learning styles
- Physical access where feasible
- Inclusive participation

Stewardship Library

Recommended future collections:

- Conservation
- Ecology
- Botany
- Environmental history
- Geography
- Community development
- Leadership
- Indigenous knowledge
- Restoration science

Photography Standards

Educational photography should show:

- Authentic field experiences
- Learning in progress
- Landscapes
- Wildlife
- Native plants
- Volunteers
- Seasonal change

Favor documentary realism over staged images.

Evaluation

Measure programs through:

- Participation
- Learning outcomes
- Volunteer engagement
- Repeat attendance
- Community feedback
- Long-term stewardship involvement

Success is measured by lasting engagement, not attendance alone.

Future Education Center

A future education center could include:

- Welcome gallery
- Stewardship exhibit
- Classroom
- Research library
- Native plant demonstration garden
- Community meeting room
- Outdoor amphitheater
- Observation deck
